

Dear Friends,

Greetings to you all in the name of our great Savior and Lord Jesus-Christ!

Let me just begin by saying thank you for your prayers during and after my surgery. I praise God that everything went very well. Now, 7 weeks after the intervention, all my concerns have gone away. I am able to resume my work at King's and my regular diet. I am also sleeping in my bed again. May the Lord bless richly the medical team of Kishwakee Hospital, our friends of Christ Community Church of St Charles, Illinois and all of you who supported us in one way or another in this special time of my life!

King's Hospital

It has been 7 months since our last letter to you. Since March the hospital has seen many improvements. The staff has doubled in number. We have hired several needed professionals in different capacities and a very competent nurse to help organize the Nursing department. We still have a long way to go to reach a desirable level but we are moving into the right direction.

Worldwide lab evaluated our needs and then installed new machines and equipments that allow us to perform a wide range of lab tests. We are now equipped to better serve our patients.

Inverters and batteries have been installed providing electricity at night. There are no more blackouts in the wards which makes our staff and the patients happier and the hospital more attractive.

Our Community program devoted to woman's health has made it possible for pregnant women to get free services for delivery at the hospital. The number of normal deliveries and C-Sections are increasing. Thank you to the Apostolic Christian Church and women of Christ Community Church for their provision of maternal kits we were able to distribute to the pregnant women as incentives to attend the antenatal clinic. This will greatly diminish the maternal mortality rate which is very high in Haiti (More than 650 for 100,000 women giving birth).

More than 132 people from 27 teams visited us during the last 12 months. They played an important role in the number of sick patients we were able to minister to at the hospital. General and Urologic surgeries were offered to several who have been waiting for years and could not afford such interventions.

King's Garden

They are able to continue their schooling in Port-au-Prince. Praise God for the Christ Community Church sponsors who are helping them and the other graduates with monthly financial allowances. Please pray for Kelida and Wilna who will be 18 this coming year. Pray also for Noel and Coffy who are in the process of being adopted by a family in Illinois.

King's School

Praise God for the success recorded last year as all the 8 children of the 6th grade passed the official exam. Among them there were Kenkenn, Wilna and Gaetan. The new school year has begun with 102 children. Continue to pray for the Principal Mr. Kendly Toussaint and the other 4 teachers. Pray also for the completion of the school building

Doctor's Apartment

Praise God for the completion of the new apartment at the Hospital and our thanks to Lumiere Medical Ministries who financially supported the construction. This 4 room apartment will be available for short and midterm missionaries coming to serve at King's. We are now praying for the furniture and appliances to equip this new wonderful facility.



Official Recognition of Kings

Let us praise God for the official recognition of King's Organization by the Government. We received the certificate last month and the publication will be in the Monitor, the official newspaper in December.

Water project

Let us also praise for the construction of the 20,000 gallon reservoir that was completed last week. It increases our capacity to stock rain water and distribute it by gravity to the children's home and the Doctors apartment. Our thanks to Christ Community Church for the funding and to Mark Dahlberg who supported this effort.

- 1) The improvement of Hubert's health
- 2) The staff of the King's institutions especially for the nursing staff capacity that it may grow and increase our service to the patients and the community
- 3) The need of a vehicle for Kings Hospital. Cost: 50,000 US dollars.
- 4) Short term visitors both medical and constructions teams to come and minister to us this coming year. We have a great need for Pediatricians as the number of children coming to our consultations is increasing.
- 5) The construction of the new Administrative building of the hospital. We hope to provide the blue prints to you all in the coming weeks. Cost: around 300,000 US dollars.
- 6) Our chaplain and staff to continue to minister to the patients and the children so more can come to know the Lord at the Hospital, School and Garden.
